Over the past eight weeks I have ended each Saturday night with a smile on my face knowing this class has allowed these teenagers the space to dream beyond their countries' borders. They have poured their hearts into their freewrites and have been kind and generous in their feedback. I mean, if I had been given this opportunity at their age, I might not have spent so much time thinking a s'more was some made up alien food!

I say all this because I believe in The Townies. I have seen what storytelling does to a kid in Zimbabwe who doesn't know crafting stories and performing them could be a path to growth and healing.
